Abstract: Sister Marie Augusta Neal, a Sister of Notre Dame for 61 years, was a prominent sociologist who focused on the changes in women's religious orders after Vatican II and the issues of social justice, especially the growing disparity between the rich and poor. Her papers contain personal mementoes, correspondence, photographs, videotapes, audiotapes and artifacts, as well as her professional papers. These include correspondence, talks, publications, chapter papers, surveys and work in the LCWR, as well as her 10 research notebooks.

Sisters' Survey

Provenance: The records were collected by Sister Marie Augusta Neal and by the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur. During her work on the surveys for the CMSW, Sister Marie Augusta Neal kept 10 research binders to organize her work. These binders were

originally stored in Room 333 at Emmanuel College until 1999 when she donated them to the Sisters of Notre Dame Archives in Ipswich, MA. In 2014, several folders of correspondence between Sister Marie Augusta Neal and her Emmanuel students working in Rhodesia [now Zimbabwe] were found and added as an accrual to the collection. They are now filed in the College Papers Series in Box 45.

Processing: An inventory of the papers was originally conducted by Sister Esther MacCarthy. The final processing and arrangement of the collection was completed in 2012.

Conservation Work: Staples were removed, documents unfolded and small tears mended.

Restrictions: The collection is available for research in the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur's Archives only. Sixteen VHS videotapes recording Sister Marie Augusta Neal's presentations from 1967 to 1994 are restricted from public access until converted into a digital format.

Biographical Information: Sister Marie Augusta Neal was born Helen Catherine Neal on June 21, 1921 in Brighton, Massachusetts, the daughter of Thomas F. and Helen A. (Taylor) Neal. She attended the Notre Dame Academy in Boston, graduated in 1938 and then went onto Emmanuel College, majoring in English with a minor in History. After graduating from Emmanuel in 1942, she joined the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur as a postulant on August 8, 1943. She entered the novitiate on Feb. 10, 1944, took her first vows on Jan. 30, 1946 and her Perpetual Vows five years later on July 30, 1951.

Sister Marie Augusta Neal taught at St. Augustine's High School in South Boston (1946-47) and St. Mary's High School in Lawrence (1947-53). In 1948, she began her work for her Master's Degree in Sociology at Boston College. Her thesis focused upon the work of Pitirim A. Sorokin, a Harvard University Professor and the founder of the Sociology Department at Harvard. Upon completion of her Master's Degree in 1953, she became a professor of Sociology at Emmanuel College and taught there for the remainder of her professional career. Sister Marie Augusta Neal began her Doctoral work at Harvard University in 1955, completing her Degree in 1963. As part of her doctoral work, she prepared and implemented a survey for Boston Diocesan priests to measure their motivations and attitudes toward change. It was this survey that became the foundation of her later work. The findings of her Doctoral Dissertation were published in 1963 and entitled Values and Interests in the Process of Social Change [2012.75.43.2]. After completing her doctoral program, she was named the head of the Sociology Department at Emmanuel. She served as the head of the department until 1973 and again for the year 1980. In addition to her work at Emmanuel, she was also a visiting professor at many universities, including the University of California at Berkeley and Harvard University.

In 1964, she was asked to serve on the Boston Archdiocesan Commission on Human Rights and as the local chair for the Governor's Commission on the Status of Women in Massachusetts. She served on this committee until 1967.

In 1959, at the Vatican's request, the Conference of Major Superiors of Women's Institutes (CMSW) was formed. Six years later, Sister Marie Augusta Neal was asked to become the director of the newly formed Research Committee of the CMSW. As director of a committee of fifteen sisters, she planned to survey American sisters and their resources in a post-Vatican II environment. While her formal connection as research director for the CMSW ended in 1974 because of lack of funding, her work on these surveys and their implications would consume much of the rest of her life.

At first, she envisioned a two stage study, but the research evolved into an ongoing project exploring the lives of women religious and their attitudes to the implementation of the decrees of the Vatican II Council. She first prepared a 27 page questionnaire in 1966 to be completed by the Superiors of the Congregations being surveyed. In 1967, she prepared the Sisters' Survey, which consisted of 649 questions addressed to nearly four hundred apostolic religious orders. She updated the survey twice, once in 1979-1980 and again in 1989-1990. She followed the original 1967 Sisters' Survey with a Study of 9 Contemplative Religious Orders in 1968; acted as a consultant for a Self-Study (1966-1969) of her own Congregation, the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur; consulted with the Jesuits in 1967 as they began their own Self-Study; and prepared an Assessment of Life and Works (1968-69). Between 1966 and 1984, Sister Marie Augusta Neal was a consultant for the Sisters of Notre Dame's General Chapters and the Massachusetts Provincial Chapters. In 1970, the Catholic Education Council of South Africa asked her to prepare a survey of South African Catholic Schools. Discovering their intentions were to examine only the white schools, she refused. Not until they agreed to include black schools in the survey did she consent to begin. The survey exposed the vast inequities between the white and black schools.

Her passion for social justice and the meticulous research used in her surveys, which delved into the attitudes and motivations of people, brought Sister Marie Augusta Neal many requests to speak at conferences, workshops and symposiums. Dozens of these presentations were published, either in professional journals or as chapters in books on sociology or social justice. She also published eight books of her own.

Her groundbreaking work earned her numerous awards and honorary degrees. She received honorary degrees from the College of Notre Dame, Belmont, CA (1977); the College of Our Lady of the Elms (1979); University of Notre Dame (1985); and St. Michael's College (1987). Her awards included the Cambridge School of Business Citation of Merit (1965); she was listed in *Who's Who in America* (1975); received the Isaac Hecker Social Justice Award from the Paulist Center (1977); the Pope John XXIII

Award (1985); was recognized for Distinguished Contributions to Teaching by the American Sociological Association (1986); was listed in the International Who's Who of Professional and Business Women (1988); elected a Fellow in the Society for Scientific Study of Religion (1989); received the Distinguished Historian Award (1992); and the Father Louis J. Luzbetak Award for Exemplary Church Research (2002).

Sister Marie Augusta Neal died on Feb. 25, 2004.

Personal Papers

Sister Marie Augusta Neal's personal papers include reunion documents for the Notre Dame Academy Class of 1938; prayercards and mementoes from her Vow Day on Jan. 30, 1946; a 1946 Last Will and Testament; a 1966 copy of her birth certificate; hymns from the funeral Mass of her mother; a 1994 copy of her Curriculum Vitae; and information for Jeanne d'Arc Camp. Sister Mary Jeanne d'Arc was a Sister of St. Joseph. She and Sister Marie Augusta Neal coauthored the article, "*An Outline for the Study of Intergroup Relations to be used by Teachers belonging to Religious Orders.*" Sister Jeanne d'Arc's correspondence with Sister Marie Augusta Neal is included with the Professional Correspondence in Box 12, Folders 2 and 3.

Also filed in the personal papers are Sister Marie Augusta Neal's traveling and financial documents, including her 1966 tax return; passports; plane tickets; insurance; Europasses; an undated address book; and her personal correspondence from 1943 to 1993. The letters to her friend Sister Grace Pizzimenti (1924-2007) discuss Sister Marie Augusta's experiences in Sao Luis, Brazil; those in Johannesburg, South Africa as she began the survey of the South African schools; her visits to Embakwe, Zimbabwe; her views while at the 1978 Chapter meetings; her travels to California in 1981 for Constitution meetings; her experiences in New Zealand for the Selwyn lectures, and other conferences. Finally, Sister Marie Augusta Neal's interest in the ongoing political

changes in the country is revealed in the comics she clipped from newspapers for her own amusement.

College Papers

Sister Marie Augusta Neal's college papers include her Emmanuel College transcripts, her 1942 Degree and papers written for her courses at Boston College in 1948 as she worked toward her Master's Degree. For her Master's Degree, Sister Marie Augusta Neal focused on the work of Pitirim A. Sorokin, the founder of the Harvard University Sociology Department. As part of this, she began a yearlong correspondence with Sorokin. These letters detail Sister Marie Augusta Neal's interest in his theories as a focal point for her thesis. The exchanges seem to have influenced much of her later work. Sister Marie Augusta Neal's Master's Degree from Boston College is housed in Box 35.

Also included with her College Papers is a paper and proposal for a program she took at Catholic University after her Master's Degree was completed. The course, on intergroup education, focused on how group interaction could be the impetus for mental, emotional and spiritual growth. She completed the paper with a proposal for a program that might implement such a group.

The papers for Sister Marie Augusta Neal's doctoral work at Harvard include eight papers written for course work; outlines for a series of lectures she gave during her doctoral program at Harvard; a summary of her Ph.D. Dissertation; a proposed research project she hoped to conduct; her transcripts, brochures and programs for her doctoral commencement; and her degree from Harvard.

Also included here are Sister Marie Augusta Neal's handwritten and typed notes outlining various books or articles. These notes outline or summarize the volume or article she was reading; many refer to sociological subjects. Because of the difficulty of identifying the year she created these notes, they have been arranged chronologically by publication date of the text Sister Marie Augusta Neal studied. While it seems at the present time most of these notes were for classes taken at Boston College or Harvard, because the publication year of some of the books came after her work at Harvard, those notes must have been used for classes Sister Marie Augusta Neal taught or for talks she eventually prepared.

Sister Marie Augusta Neal began teaching at Emmanuel in 1953 and remained there through much of her professional career. Her Emmanuel College Professional Papers include correspondence between Sister Marie Augusta Neal and the Massachusetts Provincial Superior, Sister Eleanor Joseph, regarding Sister Marie Augusta Neal's work at Emmanuel; memos and telegrams about committees she served on; 1971-72 correspondence centering on difficulties she encountered with two members of the

faculty senate; news clippings focused on the resignation of Emmanuel's president in 1978; course outlines for classes Sister Marie Augusta Neal taught; school newspapers she collected; and presentations she gave at a variety of school events.

During the 1967-1968 General Chapter, Sister Marie August Neal met Sister Mary McLeish, the superior of the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur in the Embakwe Mission in Rhodesia, now Zimbabwe. After some consultation, Sister Marie Augusta Neal arranged for some of her Emmanuel College students to work in the schools in Embakwe. During those years when her students traveled from Emmanuel to Zimbabwe, she and Sister Mary McLeish corresponded. The majority of the letters from 1968 to 1971 are from Sister Mary McLeish and focus on her struggles with the Mission, her hopes for the future of the Order, as well as her daily life as a Sister of Notre Dame. In 1972, the designation of the Embakwe mission land fell under the recently legislated Tribal Trust Land [TTL], requiring the ultimate removal of 200 families from the land. Learning of this, the Emmanuel students teaching at the mission protested and ultimately were deported from Zimbabwe. The letter from the students describing the situation and consequences of their protest, which were found in 2014 and added to the collection, are filed with the College Papers Series, in Box 45, which is stored between Boxes 3 and 4.

Also filed here are some of Sister Marie Augusta Neal's social justice petitions. These include a newsletter from the United States Committee for Justice to Latin American Political Prisoners; a petition to the President of Brazil for the decent treatment of political prisoners; papers on the Status of Women in the Church, advocating for the ordination of women; a questionnaire on the priorities for the Washington Office on Africa; and a press release entitled, "Nun-Sociologist Challenges Newman Leadership Group" at Northeastern University.

Her Emmanuel College papers contain documents centered on faculty policies and meetings, as well as memos, agendas, professional correspondence within the college and minutes of meetings with the Faculty Senate. Included here are the 1970 papers for the Self-Study Emmanuel College conducted, one that was based on the Self Study designed by Sister Marie Augusta Neal for the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur. These papers contain Sister Marie Augusta Neal's outlines of workshops which were part of the Self Study, memos and data from the survey.

Other College Papers for Sister Marie Augusta Neal's years as a visiting professor at Harvard University include professional correspondence regarding her position, syllabus's, seminar outlines and other documents collected by Sister Marie Augusta Neal during her work at Harvard. The remainder of her College Papers contains brochures and papers for college conferences Sister Marie Augusta Neal either attended or was an invited speaker and documents for courses Sister Marie Augusta Neal taught at schools other than Emmanuel or Harvard. These include Stanford University, St. John

the Evangelist College in Auckland, New Zealand, Yale University and Notre Dame Academy in Worcester.

Professional Talks and Publications

Because of her growing renown for her work in the CMSW and for social justice, Sister Marie Augusta Neal was a much sought after speaker both inside and outside the Catholic Church. She offered homilies at local Catholic and Protestant churches from 1972 to 1984. At workshops and conferences, her talks centered on social justice, the changes in the Church after the Vatican II Council and the increasing disparity between the rich and poor. Her presentations often became the basis for future articles or were eventually published as chapters in other professional volumes. During her work on the Sisters' Survey, the findings and conclusions of her research were also among many of the articles she wrote. Included here as well are her analyses of the varying degree of experimentation within American religious orders. She reported her findings on these analyses at the 1970 H. Paul Douglass lectures. Her research was later published in the *Review of Religious Research* and can be found in Box 10, Folder 5.

Sister Marie Augusta Neal's ongoing research involved examining religious order's adjustment to the new Chapter Decrees resulting from Vatican II. She also surveyed the factors that influenced membership in either conservative traditional religious orders or those that embraced Vatican II. Her research for both of these projects was originally filed in her research binders and that work is now in Box 15. She presented her findings to the International Conference on the Sociology of Religion in Lloret de Mar, Spain in 1975. That talk was later published as the "*Cultural Patterns and Behavioral Outcomes in Religious Systems: A Study of Religious Orders of Women in the U.S.A.*," and is filed with her publications in Box 10, Folder 12.

Also filed with the talks are the invitations to speak or suggestions for topics for her presentations. Because Sister Marie Augusta Neal was a meticulous researcher, she maintained extensive notes and outlines for many of her talks. Those notes and outlines are also filed here.

Sister Marie Augusta Neal's prominence soon drew many requests for her to review recently published books, especially those centered on her field of expertise, sociology. Book reviews by Sister Marie Augusta Neal can be found in Box 9, following her talks.

Professional Correspondence

Sister Marie Augusta Neal was prolific, both as an author and a correspondent. Her professional correspondence includes letters from others and, due to her meticulous record keeping, many copies of her replies. These sometimes are typed on the back of other letters or handwritten notes which her assistants would then type for her. While

the Professional Correspondence has been separated out and stored in Box 12, the nature of her work sometimes resulted in the mingling of professional and personal exchanges. Those letters which seemed devoted to friends or mostly personal issues are filed with her Personal Papers. Others concentrating on her classes or work at the various colleges have been kept with her College Papers. And any letters specifically related to her presentations or talks are with the Professional Talks and Publications. Correspondence filed under the Professional Correspondence are devoted to her research, publications and formal letters with others within the Sisters of Notre Dame, including the Provincial and Order's Superiors.

Two letters from Nicholas Sergeyeitch Timasheff, the Russian Sociologist with whom Sister Marie Augusta Neal corresponded, are stored here. However, most of her professional correspondence centered on her work on the Conference of Superiors of Women Religious, the Sisters' Survey and the Sisters of Notre Dame General Chapter meetings.

Governor's Commission on the Status of Women

From 1964 to 1967, Sister Marie Augusta Neal served on the Boston Archdiocesan Commission on Human Rights and was the local chair for the Governor's Commission on the Status of Women in Massachusetts. She also acted as the chair for the Subcommittee for the Culturally Disadvantaged. Agendas, minutes of the meetings, correspondence, commission reports, press releases, subcommittee meetings, notes and surveys conducted by Sister Marie Augusta Neal while on this commission are filed here.

Surveys and Results

In 1965 Sister Marie Augusta Neal became the director of the Research Committee of the Conference of Major Superiors of Women's Institutes (CMSW). Just after she accepted this position, she presented a paper at their 1965 Assembly entitled "A Sociologist Looks at Sisters Today." That talk can be found with the Talks in Box 7, Folder 3 and also in the bound copy of the CMSW Proceedings [2012.75.07.3.1] stored with her Professional Library.

As director of the Research Committee, she began a study of the religious orders of women as part of her effort in "implementing the Decree on the Appropriate Renewal of Religious Life" [2012.75.13.1] enacted by the recent Vatican II Council. To complete this task, she began what was meant to be a two stage study but eventually evolved into a multi-stage, ongoing survey of women religious. The first study consisted of a 27 page questionnaire aimed at Congregational Superiors. From there, she used her "Neal" scale for her 1967 Sisters' Survey, a questionnaire of 649 questions, which monitored the attitudes of American sisters in nearly four hundred apostolic orders. She then

conducted a survey of Contemplatives, as well as updates of the Sisters' Survey, in 1979-80 and again in 1989-90.

Sister Marie Augusta Neal maintained 10 research binders to organize the material from these many surveys. Though the binders were meant to focus on different categories, such as the CMSW or Sisters' Survey, because of the interconnection in her research, there is some overlap in material as well as chronological shifts in the filing. For preservation of the material, the documents have been removed from the binders and placed in manuscript folders in the exact order that was maintained by Sister Marie Augusta Neal. These binders are now filed in Boxes 13, 14, 15, 17 and 18.

The CMSW Survey papers include memos and documents that describe the process used by Sister Marie Augusta Neal for the surveys, as well as the questionnaire she prepared for the participants. Results of the surveys are stored here, including the cross-tabulations and graphs prepared by Sister Marie Augusta Neal or her assistants. Many of Sister Marie Augusta Neal's handwritten notes kept by her during the work are also here.

Included with the CMSW Survey Papers are the first Sister's Survey conducted in 1967. The questions included in the Survey are filed here, as well as the computer program Sister Marie Augusta Neal used to help tabulate the results. Also contained within the Sisters' Survey Papers is Sister Marie Augusta Neal's correspondence with other sociologists regarding her work and letters to and from Superiors of the Orders being surveyed.

As part of her research, she presented the first results of the Sisters' Survey, "Implications of the Sisters' Survey for Structural Renewal" at the CMSW National Assembly in Chicago on Sept. 24-28, 1967. Her typed talk is filed here and the audio recording of that presentation has been placed in Video Box 2012.75.39. The published proceedings of the annual assemblies of the CMSW between 1966 and 1969 are filed on the SMAN Shelves between Boxes 14 and 15.

After the first Sisters' Survey, Sister Marie Augusta Neal then prepared a Contemplatives Survey in 1968. The Contemplatives Survey questioned both male and female contemplatives from 9 different Congregations. The final report compared findings of the Sisters' Survey of apostolic Congregations to the results of the survey of Contemplatives. That research and findings are filed in Boxes 14 and 15. They include the drafts and final version of the questionnaire she used, the coding sheet to record the results, Sister Marie Augusta Neal's correspondence regarding the work, instructions for those participating in the survey, and the final report.

Following the Sisters' Survey and the Contemplatives Survey, Sister Marie Augusta Neal prepared a Chapter Decree Analysis to learn "to what degree and in what

directions the various religious orders had adapted their structures to the general principles of renewal [2012.75.14.7] Those findings were eventually presented to her colleagues, both in presentations and as published articles. As mentioned in the section on her talks and publications, that research is found in Box 15.

Papers not included in Sister Marie Augusta Neal's research binders but related to the Sisters' Survey and retests have been stored in Box 16. The Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur was one of the almost four hundred religious orders that participated in the Sisters' Survey and the findings, arranged province by province, are filed here. Sister Marie Augusta Neal's analysis of this particular survey is contained in the Analysis Binder material arranged in Box 17. Also included here is her November 24, 1967 report on the Sisters' Survey; an analysis of that report; graphs of pre and post Vatican II beliefs; and her summary of how she coded religious orders as either experimenting or non-experimenting. Because she acted as a consultant to the Jesuits when they decided to conduct their own Self-Study in 1967, those papers are also here. The final General Survey of the Society of Jesus, published in 1969 has been filed in the SMAN Professional Library [2012.75.40.17]

Any correspondence between Sister Marie Augusta Neal and those intimately involved with her work are filed in Boxes 17 and 18.

After the Sisters' Survey and the partial retest conducted in 1968, Sister Marie Augusta Neal prepared later updates of these surveys in 1979-80 and again in 1989-90 to monitor any ongoing shifts in attitudes within women's religious orders. These later surveys and results are filed in Box 18.

As part of the ongoing CMSW research and as a result of the Sisters' Survey, Sister Marie Augusta Neal then prepared an Assessment of Life and Works [ALW]. This survey was designed to measure public attitudes to religious congregations and their missions. The work for this assessment began at a 1968 summer session for advanced research at Emmanuel College. While the ALW was designed to be conducted by many religious orders, the only research and results contained in these papers are those for the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur. This particular survey was similar to the Sisters' Survey, but focused more on the people they wished to serve.

The Assessment of Life and Works began at a pivotal time, just after the Sisters of Notre Dame's first session of their General Chapter held from Dec. 1967 to March 1968 and not long before the second session of the General Chapter in 1969. The Assessment of Life and Works examined the Educational Apostolate of the Sisters, one that had been a part of their work since their founding in 1804. The effort was to evaluate the effectiveness of their "current mode of being apostolic" [2012.75.19.2]. A demographic map of the entire order was prepared for the survey, an assessment of how many sisters were available, an evaluation of all schools, hospitals and social services was done to

“determine the degree to which each facility actually provides adequately the services intended” [2012.75.19.2]. A separate assessment of finances within the Order and public attitudes toward the Sisters of Notre Dame was also conducted. These surveys were done worldwide within the Sisters of Notre Dame. That work is filed in Box 19. The Summary Report to the Apostolate Commission of the Assessment of Life and Works of the Sisters of Notre Dame was presented by Sister Marie Augusta Neal in May 1969 in Rome during their General Chapter. While findings varied some from province to province, the overall assessment determined the “need to develop within our community life a style supportive of our life of service, and witnessing to the Christian values expressed in that service” [2012.75.19.13]. The data from the Massachusetts province expressed an interest in experimenting with new forms of living together.

As part of the ALW, a survey of all the schools operated by the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur in Massachusetts was also conducted. The survey documented statistics of student enrollment between 1963 and 1969, evaluated the experience of the teachers, and compared salaries between schools. They then contrasted their findings with the same information from public schools. Papers included with the ALW education surveys include schedules for meetings, agendas and minutes of those meetings, correspondence and findings of the surveys. The Assessment of Life and Works resulted in the Sisters of Notre Dame recommitting themselves to the needs of the poor. In the end, the Sisters of Notre Dame withdrew fifty-four sisters from thirteen schools in the early 1970s. Summaries of the assessments are filed in Box 21.

Also included with the ALW Education Surveys is Sister Marie Augusta Neal’s South African Education Study, initiated by the Catholic Education Council of South Africa. Because of her extensive work in the CMSW and the Sisters’ Survey, she was asked to prepare a survey of South African white schools. This she refused. Ultimately, she conducted the survey of all South African schools, including both white and black schools. The questionnaire and published results are filed here.

Chapter Papers

With the excitement resulting from the recent Vatican II Council (1962-1965), the Sisters of Notre Dame looked forward to implementing the changes decreed. Because the Sisters of Notre Dame’s last Chapter meetings had been held in 1963, the next Chapter was originally scheduled for 1969. But with so much to accomplish, they decided to divide the meetings into 2 sessions which spanned the years 1967 to 1969. To begin the enormous preparations necessary for these meetings, the Sisters of Notre Dame decided to prepare a Self-Study of their Order. Sister Marie Augusta Neal acted a consultant for both the Self-Study and the General Chapter. The first part of this Self-Study involved a Desiderata – essentially asking the Sisters to record their feelings on any or all of 17 areas of concern. These included: Spirit and End of the Institute; Membership; Identification (Habit); Formation; Professional Training; Vows; Interpersonal Relations;

Liturgical Living; Horarium; Special Virtues; Enclosure; Apostolate; Health; Separation; Government; and Chapters. [These Desiderata papers are filed with the Chapter Papers, 2012.30.3 and 2012.30.4]

The responses were typed onto 5" x 8" slips of paper and then assembled for review. Sister Marie Augusta Neal's notes on the Desiderata are with the Self-Study papers in Box 22. Once the sister's opinions were recognized, the next phase of the Self-Study involved preparing position papers on these areas of concern. A range of ideas for the papers was decided on, and sisters were then assigned to write the papers. Over 20 of those position papers are filed here and many include comments from Sister Marie Augusta Neal within the margins. The Self-Study papers also contain correspondence, outlines for discussion techniques, schedules for meetings, minutes of those meetings, and reports of the study. As part of the effort of the Sisters of Notre Dame to keep everyone informed on the progress of the Self-Study and events leading up to the first session of the General Chapter, they published an International newsletter, *The Mirror*. Those newsletters were collected by Sister Marie Augusta Neal and include many of her comments in the margins. In the final months leading up to the 1967-68 General Chapter, the Massachusetts province prepared a questionnaire to address any concerns by their members. That questionnaire and the results are filed here, as well as the Massachusetts Provincial Chapter meeting minutes, reflections and news between July and August 1967. At the conclusion of the Self-Study in Dec. 1967, the Massachusetts Province Rule Committee prepared a report for the General Chapter entitled, "*The Sources Behind the Principles of Religious Life in the Modern World*." That and the Interim Directives for the General Chapter are filed in Box 25.

The first session of the General Chapter began in December 1967 in Rome and concluded in March 1968. Since she was a consultant to the Chapter, Sister Marie Augusta Neal collected position papers, not just from Massachusetts but also from South Africa, Rhodesia (now Zimbabwe), Brazil and Japan, as well as reports from Maryland and England. She also received the papers from the commissions on Government, Community, and the Apostolate. These commission papers include numerous proposals for changes as well as copious notes by Sister Marie Augusta Neal in the margins and on the back of the documents regarding the proceedings.

Following the 1967-68 session of the General Chapter, the sisters returned to their provinces and began their inter-session work in provincial chapters to review proposals and decisions made at the first half of the General Chapter. Sister Marie Augusta Neal's work in the Massachusetts Provincial Chapter is found in these papers. Proposals on their Apostolic Spirituality, Community (including worship, vows, and life styles), Formation, Clothing, and Apostolate were made. Correspondence, progress reports, voting records, minutes of the provincial chapter meetings, and any other documents accumulated for these meetings by Sister Marie Augusta Neal are filed here and contain many of her notes.

The second session of the General Chapter began March 29, 1969 in Rome with an address by Mother Loretto Julia, entitled "*Report on the State of the Congregation.*" She discussed the renewal sweeping through the Church and the Sisters of Notre Dame, the Sisters' Survey, the first session of the Chapter in 1967-68, the directives and inter-session meetings. Mother Loretto Julia reviewed the statistics for the provinces in 1969, listing the number of sisters in each of the provinces and their ages, the work in the schools run by the sisters, the work in the missions, the need for formation of new members and for ongoing training for all the sisters.

The Chapter Papers for the 1969 session include agendas, schedules of meetings and lists of those attending; mimeographed minutes of meetings from March 29 to June 22, 1969; corrections of those minutes; a talk presented by Father Edward Heston, C.S.C., the Secretary of Sacred Congregation for the Religious and Secular Institutes; several presentations and meetings with Father Ladislav Orsy, S.J., a professor of Canon Law, regarding the structure of government, community, prayer, apostolic spirituality, and celibacy; and a request from the Gregorian University for a Day of Peace and the liturgy for that Day (in Italian). Also filed here are the papers for the Commissions on Government, Formation, Apostolate, End and Spirit, and Community; a record of voting; the results of the questionnaire on the Interim Directives; papers regarding the changes in the Habit; Mission Secretary Papers; newsletters reporting on the proceedings for the Chapter; and Canonization Papers for the June 22, 1969 canonization of Julie Billiart, the founder of the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur.

Following the conclusion of the second session of the General Chapter, the sisters returned to their home provinces. In Massachusetts, a provincial chapter meeting was scheduled for the fall of 1969. Sister Marie Augusta Neal acted as a consultant to the meetings, most specifically for the government meetings as Massachusetts attempted to restructure its provincial government. These Provincial Chapter meetings include notes by Sister Marie Augusta Neal, correspondence between her and the Provincial Superior, Sister Marie Julienne, agendas, progress reports from the government commission and any papers Sister Marie Augusta Neal collected in her work as consultant. Also filed here is Sister Mary Linscott's June 5, 1971 Assessment of the Massachusetts Province and the Community Commission Report, most likely written in 1973.

By late 1970, the efforts of the Sisters to restructure the provincial government ended in an impasse. The polarization between those who were eager for change and those more resistant to the rapidity of such change grew so wide, that the "Monday Night Group," which included those wishing for a more consensual form of government, requested that Sister Mary Linscott, the Superior General of the Order, create a new province in Massachusetts. Ultimately, the province split into 3 sub-provinces, not divided by geographical regions but by allowing the sisters to choose that sub-province "in which they feel best able to help achieve the goals of the congregation." [The Pilot, 03-27-1971]

The “Monday Night Group” became Sub-Province B. The papers for this Sub-Province include agendas; schedules for meetings for all 3 sub-provinces; a list of 1971 transfers within the Massachusetts Province; minutes of the meetings; reports; memos; correspondence; proposals for projects aimed specifically at the neediest; a list of members; budgets and other financial information, as well as their efforts to locate an apartment for meetings and other events; procedures for reconciliation; and newsletters printed by the Sub-Province.

While the Sisters met again in 1975 for another General Chapter, the next set of Chapter Papers found with Sister Marie Augusta Neal’s Papers begin in 1977 with the bound copy of *Materials in Preparation for General Chapter 1978*. This volume outlines the results of provincial chapters worldwide and proposes agendas for the upcoming General Chapter. Other Pre-Chapter material includes a note thanking Sister Marie Augusta Neal for agreeing to be a consultant for the chapter; a desiderata from the Ohio Province; formal correspondence from Sister Mary Linscott regarding the upcoming chapter; reports from committees; a timeline to rewrite the Constitutions of the Sisters of Notre Dame; instructions for the process of Community Evaluation and those for Reflection Days scheduled for June 1978. Papers from the Ohio, California and the Boston Provinces include minutes, proposals, reports and formal correspondence.

In 1978, the Boston Province prepared numerous drafts of a Proposal for an International Government for the Sisters of Notre Dame. In addition to the many drafts worked on between 1977 and 1978, these documents also contain the overlay prepared by Sister Marie Augusta Neal for a presentation about the government structure using an overhead projector. The Boston Province also worked on many proposals on the subject of social justice. These proposals asked how the Sisters might deal with injustice in social structures and how to take a stand against racism. The Boston Provincial Chapter prepared a report presented to the Sisters in Dec. 1977. Their report contained proposals on Chapter Participation, Chapter Membership, Formation, Government and Mission. They also included reports on Chapter Events, the role of delegates, included a general government questionnaire, instructions on decision making and how to select delegates for a General Chapter. Sister Marie Augusta Neal accumulated a small amount of personal hand-written notes from friends during the Chapter meeting and those letters can be found here.

The 1978 Chapter Papers include procedures and materials for the opening of the sessions and Sister Mary Linscott’s *Report on the State and Development of the Congregation, 1975-1978*, with an addendum entitled *Atlas of the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur, 1977-1978*. The addendum reports on the state finances within the Order, lists per capita income, Sister’s salaries and other expenditures. At the 1978 Chapter, Sister Marie Augusta Neal attended the meetings for the Commissions on Mission and Justice and Government. She took copious notes at those meetings and that softbound notebook is filed with these papers. The Chapter Records for 1978 also include daily

minutes of the meetings, programs for the concluding liturgies, newsletters, and the recommendations and decisions of the General Chapter known as the Chapter Acts.

At the end of the 1978 Chapter, Sister Marie Augusta Neal returned to Boston. Her post-Chapter papers include a request from the Ohio Province for her help with the survey recently conducted by Joseph Shields of Catholic University. Sister Marie Augusta Neal's notes on the Shield Survey are here, as well as the actual survey conducted on the Ohio Province. Other post-Chapter documents include a 1979-80 province by province statistical listing of the entire Sisters of Notre Dame; documents for the Research and Planning Group for a Boston Provincial Mission Committee which planned to focus on global issues; and a 1981 update on the statistical listing of the Order, as well as some survey results.

After the 1978 Chapter, Sister Marie Augusta Neal was asked to be a member of the Constitutions Group, working to redraft the Order's Constitution. These papers consist of formal correspondence about the work; programs and bulletins for liturgies celebrated at the meetings; topics for discussion meetings; a talk by Sister Mary Linscott entitled, "The Service of Religious Authority," with Sister Marie Augusta Neal's notes in the margins; memos to the Constitution Committee; summary of responses to questionnaires; and drafts of Constitution Amendments from 1981 to 1983.

Papers for Boston Provincial meetings follow the work on the new Constitution. These documents include correspondence, memos, agendas, notes of the meetings by Sister Marie Augusta Neal, proposals and work leading up to the 1984 General Chapter. As a delegate to the Chapter, Sister Marie Augusta Neal kept handwritten notes of her observations and prepared computer printouts of her thoughts on Membership and Personal Development for Mission. Her Orientation packet includes her notes on chapter procedures and consensus; a daily schedule of meetings; weekly goals and recommendations; Sister Mary Daniel Turner's opening reflections; and presentations by Sister Juliana Casey and Bishop Patrick Kalilombe.

The Chapter Papers also contain proposals to various committees; workshops on essential elements of a Chapter meeting; papers for the Government, Selection, Steering and Agenda Committees; Minutes from July 3 to August 14, 1984; an Accountability Report of the General Government group report on Experimentation in Government from 1978 to 1984; an unofficial drafts of the 1984 Constitution and Directory of the Sisters of Notre Dame; newsletters reporting on the Chapter; and a brief evaluation of the Chapter.

Following the Chapter, Sister Marie Augusta Neal was invited to participate in the Congregational Resource Committee. She agreed and wrote an article entitled, "Congregational Study of Resources for Mission." A draft of that paper is filed here, along with graphs and other information from the Congregational Resource Committee.

Also here is a 1986 questionnaire completed by Sister Marie Augusta Neal for the 1986 March Assembly of the Boston Province.

Miscellaneous and Funeral Papers

By the early to mid-1990s, Sister Marie Augusta Neal's health problems slowed her work on the final update of the Sisters' Survey conducted from 1989 to 1990. In 1991, she projected it would take her another 3 years to complete the research from the survey. As she realized this would be her last survey, Sister Marie Augusta Neal contemplated the best repository to preserve her work. The papers of the LCWR (previously the CMSW) were housed at Notre Dame University Library Archives. With so little space in Emmanuel for her documents and findings, Sister Marie Augusta Neal collaborated with Sister Esther MacCarthy, Emmanuel's and the province of Massachusetts' archivist, as to the best plan. It was decided to send her tapes and raw data from her surveys to Notre Dame. The correspondence and memos regarding this decision, as well as Notre Dame's finding aid for the Neal collection are found with the Miscellaneous Papers.

Filed in Boxes 34 and 35 are her honorary degrees from College of Notre Dame, Belmont, CA (1977); College of Our Lady of the Elms (1979); University of Notre Dame (1985); and St. Michael's College (1987). Also here are her many awards from 1965 to 2002.

Because of her prominence, there were many articles about Sister Marie Augusta Neal. Those are included in Box 34 with the Miscellaneous Papers. And because of her ongoing work, research and interest in politics, she collected numerous new clippings and articles. These are also included with the Miscellaneous Papers.

Sister Marie Augusta Neal died Feb. 25, 2004. Obituaries for her death and programs and brochures for her funeral are filed in Box 34, Folder 11.

Recordings of Talks and Events

Many of Sister Marie Augusta Neal's talks were either videotaped or recorded. These include her presentation at the 1967 CMSW conference in Chicago, as well as her talks to other congregations. These recordings are restricted from public access until converted into a digital format.

Professional Library

Sister Marie Augusta Neal's professional library include volumes she collected for her own research, copies of journals or books in her articles were published, as well as her

own eight books. A complete listing can be found in the Organization and Container List.
