Abstract: Emmanuel College was founded by the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur in 1919 as the first Catholic women's college in Massachusetts. The college records contain the papers collected and created by the Sisters of Notre Dame. These include trustee's papers, college correspondence between college deans and presidents and the archdiocesan hierarchy, faculty papers, brochures and other papers from events, transcripts of the Sisters who attended the college and photographs collected through the years.

Provenance: The collection was transferred to the archives from the college sometime in the 1980s. Accruals continue.

Processing: The collection was processed and arranged in 2014.

Conservation Work: Staples were removed, some records removed from acidic bindings and folded papers unfolded.

Restrictions: The collection is open to the public.

Scope and Content Note: While Emmanuel College opened its doors for classes on September 22nd, 1919, its roots can be traced back to 1849, when the first Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur arrived in Boston. They settled on Stillman Street in the North End, before moving to Lancaster Street. Finally, in 1864, the sisters opened the Notre Dame

Academy on Berkeley Street. Decades passed. The convent was becoming crowded because the rising enrollment for the school forced the sisters to give up convent space to classrooms for the students. In 1891, the Harvard Bridge had opened, causing more traffic and an increase in businesses throughout the area. This, along with the rising number of students at the Academy, started the conversation about finding a new location for the academy. The sisters realized that their location would give them a good price for the property and they began to consider land on the Fenway as a possibility for the construction of a new academy.

In 1912, with the help of real estate agent John C. Kiley, the congregation purchased land on The Fenway. Sister Mary Borgia Ryan and her provincial council began the work for the move of the academy as well as the opening of the new college. They hired Boston architectural firm, Maginnis & Walsh. This company was begun in 1905 by Charles D. Maginnis and Timothy Walsh. They soon became known for their innovative design and Gothic architecture. Michael D. Mealey & Co. was hired for the construction of the new building. The cornerstone of the Academy (now known as the Administration Building at Emmanuel College) was blessed by Rev. Edward J. Mealey on June 25, 1914.

That same year, Sr. Bernardine Marie Daly (1860-1942) was named Superior of the Notre Dame Academy. She was given the responsibility of overseeing the move to The Fenway and for the construction of the building that would house the Academy and what would later become Emmanuel College. The work required her to maintain continual communication with the architects and builder. Sr. Bernadine Marie managed the construction accounts, the many dozens of donations and gifts to the project, as well as fielded any questions the architects or builder had regarding problems encountered, such as the crack that appeared soon after the porch had been completed.

The move of the Academy from Berkeley Street to the Fenway in 1916 took almost a month, and involved continual trips between sites as furniture and equipment were removed, packed and transported.

Notre Dame Academy at the Fenway originally planned to open on September 12th, 1916 but that had to be postponed until October 2nd because of an epidemic of polio in the city. On opening day, 165 students had registered but a month later, that number rose to over 200. As part of its curriculum, the NDA also included a number of lectures and recitals for the students. In November of 1916, the Chapel was completed. The stained glass windows in the Chapel were designed by the firm of Alexander S. Locke. They were responsible for many cathedral and church windows including St. Mary's Chapel at Boston College, the St. Patrick's Basilica in Montreal, and All Saints Church in NYC. Near the end of 1916, Fr. Timothy Danahy from Needham donated a large art collection to the school, which included oil and water color paintings, etchings and engravings as well as statues carved in marble and bronze. The collection also included pottery and other artifacts. These all became part of the original museum for the new college.

Upon completion, the building included a gymnasium, dining room, libraries, museum, classrooms, laboratories, needlework department and an auditorium for 600.

Sister Bernadine Marie's work came to fruition in 1919 when Emmanuel College opened with much ceremony and excitement. The examinations for any NDA students who wished to attend the new college were held on May 26th, 1919. Registration opened for the new Emmanuel College on September 15th and classes opened on Monday, September 22nd for twenty-seven young women. By the following year that number multiplied to seventy-two.

While the college had opened, Sr. Helen Madeleine Ingraham, Emmanuel's first Dean of Students worked to provide the college accreditation from the state of Massachusetts, giving them the authority to grant college degrees to the students. Because the NDA also occupied the same building, the college had little space in which to hold classes. This required Sr. Helen Madeleine's office to be available as a classroom. This continued until 1931, when NDA moved to Granby Street, almost a mile away. During the first two years of the college's existence, Sr. Helen Madeleine labored to insure that the college would become accredited. This required hiring professors and preparing an appropriate curriculum. The first courses included Sacred Scripture, Apologetics, Biology, English, Mathematics, Spanish, French, German, Logic, Chemistry, History, Philosophy, Psychology, Economics, Sociology, Oral Expression and Latin, which Sr. Helen Madeleine taught. There was also training in Physical Education for the students. This finally happened on April 12, 1921, a year and a half after the college's opening. During this time, Sr. Helen Madeleine had to arrange for qualified professors. Some of these professors were priests from the Archdiocese. The first curriculum included Sacred Scripture, Apologetics, Biology, English, Mathematics, Spanish, French, German, Logic, Chemistry, History, Philosophy, Psychology, Economics, Sociology, Oral Expression and Latin, which Sr. Helen Madeleine taught. There was also training in Physical Education.

The college's Board of Trustees was established on September 24, 1921 and the members were the college's president, Sister Adela de Sacre Coeur Gils, and Sisters Florine Curtin, Berchmans Saunders, Joseph Louise Scannell, Mary Victorine O'Neill, Helen Madeleine Ingraham, and Mary of St. Claire O'Connell.

In 1931, NDA moved to Granby Street, into Cardinal O'Connell's former residence, which now gave the college more space. In 1933, the trustees bought more land beside the college with an eye to the future possibility of expansion. Until 1944, the Board of Trustees was comprised of only Sisters of Notre Dame. That changed in 1944, when they asked Cardinal Richard Cushing to become one of their board members.

As the college grew, a new building was needed and fundraising began in the mid to late 1940s. In 1949, the new Alumnae building was opened to expand their science facilities. In 1950, Sr. Helen Madeleine resigned as the College's Dean and not long after Sr. Alice Gertrude Keating was named the president of the college. She worked to transform the college from a commuter college to a residential one. Marian Hall, St. James Hall and Julie Hall were built during her time as president. Also, during those years, sisters began taking classes with the students, rather than just on weekends or during the summer.

The college has continued its growth and today has more than 2500 undergraduate

and graduate students from 44 countries enrolled in 50 majors and areas of concentration.

The collection includes convent registers, charge lists, annals, journals, council minutes, financial records, trustee papers, college incorporation documents, college charter, correspondence between the college's deans and others, college papers, event brochures, commencement flyers, college assessments, faculty papers, curriculum committee papers, academic advisory papers, alumni papers, scrapbooks, yearbooks, college brochures and catalogs, course schedules, various departmental papers, student publications, including theses from early graduates of the Master's program, and other student papers.

The College Administration Correspondence focuses primarily on letters between the Student Dean, College President and the Archdiocese of Boston, mainly with Archbishop and later Cardinal Cushing. The Margaret Leahy Papers in Box 12 contain theater papers she collected, as well as letters sent to her while a student at Emmanuel. The transcripts of Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur created during their classes at Emmanuel are restricted only to these former students and/or their families.
