

Notre Dame Villa

Short History

Notre Dame Villa was the property in Saratoga brought in 1905 to provide a place of rest for tired sister teachers. From 1923 -1934 the property and the house were shared with the Notre Dame Institute. From 1934-1937, the property was transformed into the Provincial Motherhouse and Novitiate. During this time a small community of sisters were living there.
